Bosch x Tsuzuki Ward, Yokohama: initiative based on comprehensive partnership agreement

Bosch hosts free concerts by the Stuttgart Chamber Orchestra at Bosch Hall

- ▶ Approximately 600 attendees, mainly residents of Tsuzuki Ward, enjoyed German performances at the daytime "Family Concert" and evening "Evening Concert."
- ▶ Part of the daytime performance was transmitted live on the BFTV large video screen in the all-weather plaza.
- ▶ The concerts were part of the comprehensive partnership agreement to invigorate the local community signed with Tsuzuki Ward, Yokohama.
- ▶ Christmas events to be held at Bosch Forum Tsuzuki on December 6 and 7; Bosch will also participate in "German Christmas Market in Tsuzuki 2025."

Yokohama (Japan) — Bosch Corporation, the Japanese subsidiary of Robert Bosch GmbH, a leading global supplier of technology and services, hosted concerts by the Stuttgart Chamber Orchestra*¹ at Bosch Hall on November 26, 2025. These concerts were held as part of a comprehensive partnership agreement with Tsuzuki Ward, Yokohama.

The concerts were held as part of the "Promotion of cultural activities" under the "Comprehensive partnership agreement to invigorate the local community," which Bosch signed last year with Tsuzuki Ward, Yokohama aiming to create a lively community. For these concerts, Bosch invited the world-renowned Stuttgart Chamber Orchestra, based in Stuttgart, Germany, where the Bosch Group has its headquarters.

On the day of the event, a "Family Concert" was held for preschool children and their families, followed by an "Evening Concert" for those of elementary school age and above. A total of 600 attendees, mainly residents of Tsuzuki Ward selected by lottery, enjoyed authentic German performances. Additionally, the afternoon concert was transmitted live for viewing on the BFTV large video screen at the all-weather plaza (known as "Platz"), located between Bosch Hall and

the Bosch office building.

Furthermore, as part of the initiatives under the comprehensive agreement, Bosch will host the Christmas event "Xmas Days at Bosch Forum Tsuzuki" at Bosch Forum Tsuzuki, following last year's event. Bosch will also participate in the "German Christmas Market in Tsuzuki 2025," further contributing to the creation of a lively local community.

*1 The Stuttgart Chamber Orchestra is a German chamber orchestra based in Stuttgart, Germany, where the Bosch Group also has its headquarters. Robert Bosch GmbH has long supported its activities. Also in Japan, Bosch Corporation has regularly sponsored concerts by the orchestra since 2012.

*2 Bosch Forum Tsuzuki is the name of the entire area, including the Bosch's headquarters, Bosch Hall, and the all-weather plaza.

Bosch Corporation is responsible for the development, manufacturing, sales and services of automotive original equipment, automotive aftermarket products and power tools. Bosch Engineering K.K. provides engineering services, such as development and application for automotive systems. ETAS K.K. develops and provides engineering of development support tools of electrical control units. Bosch Rexroth Corporation develops and manufactures hydraulics, FA module components and other systems which contribute to industrial technologies. In 2024, Bosch Japan achieved sales to third parties of some 428 billion yen and employed approximately 6,300 associates.

The company was set up in Stuttgart in 1886 by Robert Bosch (1861–1942) as "Workshop for Precision Mechanics and Electrical Engineering." The special ownership structure of Robert Bosch GmbH guarantees the entrepreneurial freedom of the Bosch Group, making it possible for the company to plan over the long term and to undertake significant upfront investments in the safeguarding of its future. Ninety-four percent of the share capital of Robert Bosch GmbH is held by Robert Bosch Stiftung GmbH, a limited liability company with a charitable purpose. The remaining shares are held by Robert Bosch GmbH and by a company owned by the Bosch family. The majority of voting rights are held by Robert Bosch Industrietreuhand KG. It is entrusted with the task of safeguarding the company's long-term existence and in particular its financial independence – in line with the mission handed down in the will of the company's founder, Robert Bosch.
